### **Quality Catholic Schools Survey**

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will be once again participating in the Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) survey.

The QCS survey provides information from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community, and assists us in our focus on continuous improvement.

Between 21 March and 1 April 2016 all staff and all year 5 and 6 students, and 60 randomly-selected parents will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20-30 minutes to complete.

This year we will again be able to get even more information about the link between student wellbeing and learning outcomes. To do this we will need to include a student identifier in the student survey. The survey will still remain confidential and individual survey responses will not be accessible by the school or the Catholic Education Office.

An independent survey consultant (Insight SRC) who manages the data collection will ensure the survey data is kept strictly confidential. Each school will receive a de-identified information report at the end of May to help them to develop strategies for further improvement. This will definitely help us in working with all students to improve their learning. If you have concerns, please feel free to contact Mrs Hines.

As a parent if you are randomly-selected to complete the survey, I would encourage your participation as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement.

# Learning Matters

Holy Spirit has been an EMU school for a number of years now. Classroom teachers have had Professional Learning around how best to advance the mathematics learning of all the children in their class. After initial assessment at the beginning of the year, the teachers develop activities that will improve and consolidate the mathematical understanding of the children. Students are often given goals that they need to work towards.

There are four key beliefs that underpin the EMU program:

- 1. Children construct mathematical ideas from their experiences;
- 2. Children learn through being actively and intensively engaged in mathematical learning experiences;
- 3. Children construct mathematical ideas through discussing, listening, simulating and reflecting upon their mathematical experiences;
- 4. Mathematical learning involves taking risks and this requires confidence.

One of the contexts in which the program works is within the home and community. As parents and carers you may be required to take part in a mathematics task that is part of Homework. This may be a supervisory role or as an active participant, such as playing a number game. Your participation is always welcomed and needed. Remember it's your attitude to learning that will greatly affect your child's attitude as they grow. There are many simple things that you can do on a day-to-day level to develop mathematical understanding and a positive mindset to learning. During the holidays I overheard a Mum asking her child to weigh one kilo of tomatoes. When the scale didn't quite show one kilo she asked the child; "How many more tomatoes should we add to make it one kilo?"

It's that easy. Let's think about all the concepts that we could tick off from that little interaction:

- Mass is measured using grams and kilograms
- The actual amount of tomatoes that might equal one kilogram
- Scales are used to measure mass
- We pay for the weight of the fruit or vegetable
- We can estimate how much objects weigh


