Learning Matters

Welcome to Week 8.

This term has been packed with many activities and processes. This included the assessment of your child's Mathematical knowledge using the MAI Tool. The MAI (Mathematical Assessment Interview) is part of the EMU process. Extending Mathematical Understanding (EMU) is a research-based intervention program developed by Dr Ann Gervasoni of ACU in association with the Early Numeracy Research Project (1999-2002).

The EMU Program has been shown by detailed research to improve children's learning and confidence with mathematics. It enhances their mathematical understanding through rich mathematical experiences. Children are actively involved in "hands on" mathematical learning. They use equipment to assist in developing mathematical knowledge, share and listen to the learning of their peers and reflect on and record their understandings in a supportive, fun and challenging environment.

As a school, our MAI results have shown growth. The teachers and the students are now familiar with the program and continue to refine and develop their skills. The older children at Holy Spirit are working on their Maths goals with their teachers. This is a useful activity as the student owns their learning and understands the steps they need to progress and improve their understanding.

If you would like to help your child with their understanding of Mathematics I have included a couple of tips which have been drawn from the experiences of Ann Gervasoni and the teachers who have implemented the EMU program.

- 1. Provide children with lots of experiences with counting quantities between 20 and 200 and providing proof for the total that convinces others. Such experiences assist children to notice that number words represent quantities and they also develop fast ways of checking totals.
- 2. When children are working with or counting quantities, ask questions such as:

What is one more? What is one less? What is ten more? What is ten less? These questions for

These questions focus children's attention on the nature of the quantity they are working with and ensure that they are not simply reading or writing numerals without paying attention to their mathematical meaning.

It all sounds very simple, but with repetition and success, thinking is changed and learning improves.

The Australian Childhood Vision Impairment Register

The Australian Childhood Vision Impairment Register is hosted by the Royal Institute for Deaf and Blind Children and is supported by Vision Australia and Guide Dogs. It is the first national register of children in Australia with vision impairment. The Register has been collecting data since 2009, and this data is providing important information about the types of eye disease and vision disorders children have and the support they need. The data is also used by service providers and researchers. Data is stored securely and no child can be identified in any way when the data is released.

Families are invited to register their child (aged 0-18 years) if they have vision impairment in both eyes which has been diagnosed by an eye specialist or ophthalmologist. Registration can be completed by contacting Register staff on (02) 9872 0303, or by visiting the VI Family Network website at: www.vifamilynetwork.org.au. The website also provides information on eyes and vision; family support; education and related issues; braille and low vision aids; technology supporting vision impairment; newsletters from Australian low vision agencies and support groups, useful websites; and news and events that might interest families across Australia.
