Learning Matters

This term the students from K-6 have been completing a Gymnastics program delivered by Miss Macallister to cover the Physical Education component of PDHPE (Personal Development, Health and Physical Education)

The students have shown enthusiasm, perseverance and overall improvement in meeting the outcomes for each stage.

Kindergarten:

Performs basic movement patterns to show actions of the whole body.

Demonstrates a general awareness of how basic movement skills apply in play and other introductory movement experiences.

Stage 1 (Year 1 & 2)

Follows a simple sequence that links basic movement patterns.

Demonstrates maturing performance of basic movement and compositional skills in a variety of predictable situations.

Stage 2 (Year 3 & 4)

Demonstrates control in performing sequences of introductory gymnastic movements.

Displays a focus on quality of movement in applying movement skills to a variety of familiar and new situations.

Stage 3 (Year 5 & 6)

Demonstrates coordinated actions of the body when performing gymnastic sequences.

Refines and applies movement skills creatively to a variety of challenging situations
