- Involving your children in unpacking groceries and checking off items on the docket
- Asking your child to help you calculate items eg how many bananas they think you might need if everyone in the family ate a banana each day for a week.

Learning Matters

Dear Parents,

Over the last weeks there have been five separate incidents involving young children being hit by vehicles. These events affect the families and school communities to which the children belong. Children can be easily distracted and are often too small to be seen by drivers. They are sometimes unable to predict or identify dangers and tend to act impulsively.

The staff of Holy Spirit have the well being of all the children in mind and reinforce good practice around road and car safety.

I have included a few reminders about safety around our school.

- Make sure your child is in an appropriate car seat that is fitted and used correctly, and that they are buckled in before you drive off.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school area.
- Most 40km/h school zones operate between 8:00am and 9:30am and from 2:30pm till 4:00pm. The speed limit must be observed even if school children cannot be seen or it is a **pupil free day** (as in this Friday).
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns using the school's main driveway. We ask you to enter Todd Row from the Melville Road end.
- Drop off your children and pick them up on the school side of the road.
- Our "Kiss'n'Ride" area is on Todd Row. This is the safest place to drop off children. When doing so please be mindful of other parents and move along the "Kiss'n'Ride" zone rather than stopping in front of the driveway.
- If you need to get out of your car then "Kiss'n'Ride" is not for you.
- Where there is a school crossing supervisor (the lovely Pauline) at a school crossing, pedestrians must wait on the footpath, at least one step back from the edge of the road, until the school crossing supervisor indicates that it is safe to walk.
- Park safely even if it means walking further to the school gate. The parking area opposite the main crossing on Moore Street offers a good choice.

I have written about being safe around Holy Spirit a couple of times in the past and generally people follow the rules and our children have been safe. It only takes one instance when a wrong judgment is made and nobody wants to be in that position.

Stay safe.


Stage 3 Boys Soccer Gala Day

ASTRONOMY NIGHT Saturday, 7 June (7pm – 9pm) WHAT YOU CAN DO WITH A RADIO DISH OR TWO

Radio astronomy involves looking at light from the weakest part of the electromagnetic spectrum, which has such little energy that giant radio dishes are needed to collect it. We'll look at what you can do with a dish or two (or a few thousand), including historic discoveries, the space program, pulsars, radio dishes in space, future massive radio telescopes, and so on.

The night will also include a 3D astronomy movie that will run for 15-20 minutes, a tour of the dome area and stargazing through various computerised telescopes. Our program will run regardless of the weather.
