Dear Parents and Carers,

Increasing the vocabulary of our students is a focus at Holy Spirit this year. This is evidence by our wonderful 'Write-a-thon', an increased focus in the classroom, our word of the week (for infants and primary) and professional learning for teachers.

Research suggests that vocabulary is enormously important to children's development, especially in reading and writing. Children also learn new words through reading independently. Children who read more tend to have richer vocabularies. When we engage students in motivational activities to encourage reading, we are simultaneously improving their vocabularies. I have often written about the importance of reading and continue to encourage reading to improve many literacy-based skills.

We want children to notice and learn new words when they encounter them. There are many ways to draw children's attention to and interest in words around them. Playing with words through games, songs, and humour can be powerful. Simply encouraging children to recognise when they have encountered new words, and to notice special characteristics of words or similarities to other words will also raise word consciousness.

Teachers are continually trying to inspire the children so that learning new vocabulary is a fun experience. Thank you to our parents and family members who came to visit our shoe gallery which motivated many exciting stories and even assisted their children to add interesting words to the display and thank you for supporting the children in the Write-a-thon.

Safety at School

The safety of your children is of the upmost importance at Holy Spirit. Please remember the following:

- In the afternoons, parents are **NOT** allowed to park and leave their car to pick up children in the designated Kiss-n-Ride area. This stops the movement of cars in the queue as they wait for you to return to your car. The Kiss-n-Ride area is a drop off/pick up zone from 8.00am-9.30am and 2.30pm-4.00pm. Parents are to **REMAIN** in their car and children to enter from the kerbside.
- Parents are asked NOT to use the parish driveway to complete a u-turn it is dangerous, as it blocks traffic coming in the opposite direction and there is always the chance of a child (not necessarily from our school) walking behind the vehicle.
- Parking in the parish carpark is **NOT** permitted. Also please do not walk your child through the carpark in the morning or afternoon.

Please follow the guidelines outlined by the school and keep safety, not convenience a priority.

Early Departure/Late Arrivals

If your child arrives late to school a parent must accompany them to the office to sign an absence note.

Children leaving school early must be collected from the school office by an adult. Please understand that we are not able to allow a child to go home with someone unless we have had written permission.

All absences including late/early absences are recorded on the roll.

As the whole class learning time is disrupted when children arrive late or leave early, it is important that this situation is avoided. Where possible appointments should be made outside of school hours.



BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that all volunteers complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering at schools. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.


