Learning Matters

Dear Parents,

This is the last week for Early Bird Reading for this term. It will resume again in the second week of Term 3. Children who filled their Early Bird Reading card will receive a special certificate. We hope to have these distributed by next week.

Most Tuesday and Wednesday mornings were a very busy time in the MPA. It was wonderful to see so many children arrive with their readers and willingly be part of this "readathon". I would like to say thank you to the parents who made sure their children were at school on time to participate and for encouraging their child to improve their reading ability.

Research over the past two decades has identified repeated reading as the key strategy for improving students' fluency skills. Repeated reading has two essential elements: 1) Giving students the opportunity to read and then re-read the same text, and 2) having students practice their reading orally with an opportunity to receive corrections and guidance. (if necessary). The Early Bird Reading sessions give the children the opportunity to re-read the same text, receive some guidance and encouragement from their tutors and the opportunity to read to someone different.

The Tutors at Holy Spirit are a very generous group. They would often line up several times to listen to their buddies read. They did this with a positive attitude and a smile on their face. How wonderful that they are able to pass on their love of reading to the younger members of our school.

Thanks also to the teachers who would see me hurriedly setting up for the session and would stop and lend a hand, at times joining the tutors queue to listen to the readers.

In this instance everyone has worked together for the common good.....learning. This is another example of the Holy Spirit community upholding our motto:

Administration

Safety at School

The safety of your children is of the upmost importance at Holy Spirit. Please remember the following:

- In the afternoons, parents are **NOT** allowed to park and leave their car to pick up children in the designated Kiss-n-Ride area. This stops the movement of cars in the queue as they wait for you to return to your car. The Kiss-n-Ride area is a drop off/pick up zone from 8.00am-9.30am and 2.30pm-4.00pm. Parents are to **REMAIN** in their car and children to enter from the kerbside.
- Parents are asked not to use the parish driveway to complete a u-turn it is dangerous, as it blocks traffic coming in the opposite direction and there is always the chance of a child (not necessarily from our school) walking behind the vehicle.
- Parking in the parish carpark is <u>NOT</u> permitted. Also please do not walk your child through the carpark in the morning or afternoon.

Please follow the guidelines outlined by the school and keep safety, not convenience a priority.

Kiss-n-Ride

Just a reminder to parents that Kiss-n-Ride finishes at 3.30pm. All students need to be picked up by this time. We understand on the odd occasion that parents/carers may be delayed, if so please contact the school office.

Early Departure/Late Arrivals

If your child arrives late to school a parent must accompany them to the office to sign an absence note.

Children leaving school early must be collected from the school office by an adult. Please understand that we are not able to allow a child to go home with someone unless we have had written permission.

All absences including late/early absences are recorded on the roll.

As the whole class learning time is disrupted when children arrive late or leave early, it is important that this situation is avoided. Where possible appointments should be made outside of school hours.

Primary Athletics Carnival

Just a reminder that the Primary Athletics Carnival (Years 3-6) is on Thursday 11th June at Blair Athletics Oval Creek Road, St Marys. Students will be transported to and from the ground by bus. Students are to wear their sports uniform and/or house colours.
