Extra Curricular Activities at Holy Spirit include:

Chess: Between two and four teams compete in the Penrith RSL chess tournament in term 3. The children each play 7 games against students from the surrounding area.

Strings: Students in Years 3-6 at Holy Spirit have the opportunity to participate in the 'strings program'. Currently there is tuition for the violin, viola and cello.

Guitar: The guitar club operates at lunch time on Fridays with Mr Green - (Students in Years 3 - 6.)

Public Speaking: Our year 6 students annually compete in the Diocesan 'Voice of Youth' competition. Students compete at cluster level and if successful compete at diocesan level.

Electives: Students in years 1, 5 and 6 participate in an electives program. They choose from a variety of activities including yoga, cooking, table tennis, sewing, hairdressing and technology. Parents and carers assist with the success of this program.

Choir: Mrs Green oversees the school choir with students from grades 2-6. The choir performs at our assemblies, school liturgies and whole school Masses.

Gardening: Students help Ms Brooker with our vegetable gardens. Visitors to our school often comment on our lawns and gardens which are a credit to our maintenance man Mr Follan and Ms Brooker.

Sport: Holy Spirit has been successful in our application for funding for specialised gymnastic tuition for years 3-6 in 2016. This will take place in the second semester. We continue to represent teams at sport gala days including soccer, netball and touch football.

Maths and English Competitions: Each year students in years 3-6 are invited to participate in these university competitions.

Social Justice: The students at Holy Spirit regularly engage in outreach to St Vincent De Paul, Project Compassion and Catholic Mission. This is done through donations of money, hampers and required items (e.g. socks during winter).

Operation Art: Each year classes prepare art work for this competition. Holy Spirit has been successful in the past with our art being displayed in the Olympic Park precinct.

School Committee

Funds raised from our school committee have enabled the purchase of over \$4000 worth of new bench seating around the playground. Thank you.


Mrs Karen Dillon will replace Cheryl. Karen will begin here on Monday 8th August.

Assistant Principal

Our maths goal this year is centred on developing the children's understanding of multiplication and division. The term that describes this understanding is 'multiplicative thinking'. Our aim is to develop a deeper understanding around what multiplication and division is, and how to use multiplicative thinking to solve open-ended maths problems.

In order to do this, our staff has engaged in professional learning to deepen our own understanding. This includes staff meetings, professional learning days (outside of school) as well as professional reading. Chris Hurst from Curtin University has written an article about multiplicative thinking. He explains that multiplication and division are sometimes taught as separate entities, whereas the "multiplicative situation" is rich in connections and links.

One of the critical elements that Chris Hurst discusses is the need to develop a deep understanding of multiplicative arrays. An array, is the arrangement of objects, pictures, or numbers in columns and rows. This array shows 3x5. There are 3 groups, with five in each group.



We can also look at factors and multiples as well as area and fractions. The use of correct language and concrete materials helps the children to make connections before they are introduced to the symbols used for multiplication and division.

Hurst concludes by stating that this conceptual development takes place over time and requires a whole school approach beginning in Kindergarten. The use of the array assists children to make connections and links. Today we heard from some year 2 parents whose children are able to use arrays during their mathematics lessons to help them solve problems and are able to recognise arrays in their environment. They have taught their parents what an array is! Well done Year 2.

Reflection of Year of Mercy

In our last newsletter I referred to an article by Vanita Wright who authors the digital Magazine 'National Catholic Reporter'. She was reflecting on what Mercy might look like in the everyday. In what follows, she speaks about Mercy in the context of 'power'.

I was at a conference recently, and it was interesting to observe how the well-known, powerful people wore their power, how they responded to others' admiration, how they spoke to those who were not so well-known or admired. Some used their power to make room for others and invite their voices; others used their power to dominate the space and the conversation.

In my own work, I have achieved a certain level of expertise and others' respect. When I sit in a room with colleagues, they feel the weight of my opinions. With a sentence or a glance, I can crush or I can encourage. I can open up the conversation or shut it down.

Most of my sins involve failure at mercy. Whether through my unhopeful opinion of someone, my silent sentences that criticize him, my words grinding away in the privacy of a moving car, my neglect to help, or my refusal to notice when help is needed -- each failure of mercy denies the community a bit of healing that might have happened.'

We may not wield the power of a corporate executive, but we each hold power in our own circumstances, perhaps it comes with position in our employment, or club, or family. In all these circumstances, authentic mercy treats power as a sacred trust. I can be merciful because I have some sort of power... the means to affect another's life, if only for a moment.

We pray for the insight to act mercifully in exercising our power... to do kindness in our families, our workplaces, our world.
