Dear Parents and Carers,

I recently read an article about keeping children safe, respectful and responsible online.

Given the prevalence of the internet and social media it is important that children learn responsible online behaviour to keep them safe.

Parents support children with their social skills and these skills are transferable to 'social media' situations. That is children online should participate in a respectful and safe way.

Young people's use of technology should be age appropriate. This requires a high level of supervision but even so children may be exposed to anti-social media on the internet.

By taking an active role in monitoring and limiting access, as needed, we can assist in preparing young people for future independent and responsible online use.

Top Tips for Parents to Help Keep Your Child Safe Online (Catholic Outlook July 2016)

- Be aware of how your child uses the internet and explore it with them;
- Discuss with your child the importance of keeping personal information private;
- Talk about cyberbullying and remind your child online communication should be responsible and respectful;
- Advise your child not to respond to any negative messages;
- Consider using inbuilt filters and controls on your digital devices to manage your child's access; and
- Keep your virus protection up to date.

Assistant Principal

This is the fourth week of the term and the third week of Early Bird Reading for this term. Early Bird Reading takes place during Terms 2 and 3. The procedures remain the same. They are:

- A call is made inviting the readers and tutors into the MPA
- Readers and tutors line up and are paired with one another
- The reading and sharing takes place
- Everyone has a card which is stamped at the end of the session

Early Bird Reading gives the children an opportunity to read aloud to a partner. Reading aloud is widely recognised as the single most important activity leading to language development. Among other things, reading aloud builds word-sound awareness in children, a strong predictor of reading success.

"Children who fall seriously behind in the growth of critical early reading skills have fewer opportunities to practice reading. Evidence suggests that these lost practice opportunities make it extremely difficult for children who remain poor readers during the first three years of primary school to ever acquire average levels of reading fluency." Torgeson, J. Avoiding the Devasting Downward Spiral, American Educator. (2004)

Reading aloud is a great way to stimulate language and cognitive skills. It builds motivation, curiosity and memory. Early Bird Reading develops friendships across the grades and allows the older children to be role models by listening attentively and supporting the younger students as they learn new skills. So encourage your child to join us on a Tuesday and Wednesday morning in the MPA as we learn and grow together.

With this in mind, let me invite you once again to participate in our Augustinian Prayer which provides our students with that sacred space and silence in which to nurture their inner spirit, develop their relationship with God, and strengthen them for... works of mercy. Augustinian prayer is at 3pm (each odd week) throughout the year.


Parents please ensure you clearly label your child's belongings. We have many unlabelled items in our lost property cupboard located in the MPA.


Kiss-n-Ride
