Andrew believes that some people (adults and children) find a way to get what they want and use that approach over and over.

He suggests the following tips to help us all continue to grow:

- Recapture your spirit. Invite the valued people in your life to
 do fun things with you. Regardless of whether they initially
 accept or decline, keep making invitations.
- Increase your strengths. Take a long hard look at yourself. What parts of yourself are your strengths? What do people like about you? What makes you a good friend? Make a commitment to display those very characteristics to the world!
- Change yourself first. As much as the behaviour of 'other people' may annoy you, it is important to recognise that they are trapped and only have a limited repertoire of ways of relating to others. If you want more friendship, be a friend to others. One of the great lessons that human life has for us is that we generally get back what we give out.

So let the creative juices flow!


