Dear Parents and Carers,

At our recent Kindergarten orientation parent meeting I shared the following story from the parent helpline:

Children need a soft place to fall

As adults, we often get so caught up in our own lives that it's easy to forget the struggles that children face in their daily lives. Whilst we are managing multiple needs, relationships, finances, housework, work and extended family issues, it can be hard to appreciate that a child's world is complex at times as well.

Many times we get to the school gate or the bus stop to pick up our child and we are hurried and stressed, thinking about all we have to do when we get home. We often miss the opportunity of being present in the moment and the non- verbal and verbal cues that children give us about how they are feeling, what their day is like and what they might need from us.

At the end of the day when we greet them there might be a lot of things that our children are trying to process. They might be confused by how a friend has behaved, or worried that they won't get selected for a team they want to play in. They might have a happy moment that they also want to share with us, as the most important people in their world. The list is endless.

Many times children are greeted at the school gate, asked lots of questions, whisked away to an after school activity, followed by a rushed dinner, homework and bedtime. Increasingly, families have busier timetables and multiple commitments.

What a nice welcome it is for a child to walk to the school gate to be greeted by a parent or carer who was happy to see them, interested in them and present. Children often need to reconnect with their parent and receive some comfort after being at school for a long day. This might only take a few minutes, eye contact, a soft face, warm words, a tender touch and focus on what the child is telling you with both the tone and content of their words and also their actions.

New Enrolment Policy and Procedures

In September 2014, a new enrolment policy and procedures were approved for use by Catholic systemic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta.

What has changed?

Under the previous enrolment policy, Catholic families were asked to enroll their child/ren in their local parish or 'feeder' school. Recognising the changing nature of work and family life, the new policy allows Catholic families greater choice, by removing the concept of feeder parishes and schools.

Catholic families may now apply for enrolment in a Catholic school anywhere in the Diocese.

Where places are limited, priority will be given in order to:

- Catholic children who live in the local parish
- · Catholic children from other parishes
- · Children of families who actively participate in the life of the school and local parish community (e.g. siblings)
- · Orthodox children
- · Children from other Christian faiths
- · Children of non-Christian faiths

Learning Matters

Dear Parents,

The end of the year is fast approaching. It's a busy time for all, organising Christmas and the holiday break. We all need a rest, including the children. They have worked hard throughout the year and as the end of term comes to an end they too get very tired. Teachers find that after the long Christmas break that sometimes the children will fall back a little with their reading. There is a strong emphasis on reading at Holy Spirit and it would be a great idea if the practice of reading was to continue during the break.

You might be really lucky and have a child who loves to read, and will do so without any reminders from you. But if you don't, you will battle. Not everyone has to be an avid reader. We need to read to survive in our world. Print is all around us. I remember reading a Reader's Circle book with a group of Year 4 children. The book was called "I Hate Books". The main character in the story did hate books because he couldn't read. In this case the whole family became involved to encourage him to read. In the end there was success. In some instances you might have to involve the whole family in encouraging and making time to read with your non-reader child. When reading or any other skill is seen as important and worthwhile gains are made. I just had a conversation with a parent who explained that the whole family are involved with helping their youngest move forward with his mathematics. And what gains he has made! Working together and having the same mindset does work.

With constant practice words are recognised automatically. Reading becomes faster, smoother and more expressive as confidence increases. Children move from reading out loud to silent reading which is obviously a faster process. There are two general approaches to improving reading and fluency. One is a direct approach which involves modelling and practice and repeated reading and the indirect approach involves encouraging the children to read voluntarily in their free time. Voluntary reading gives the children the opportunity to read for pleasure. It would be excellent if they saw you reading in your spare time. That would be great modelling. In reality, it may be difficult to find the time to read for yourself or to listen to your child read, but during the break if the opportunity arises, seize it!
