In week 6 we hosted 60 teachers from Emmaus College. These teachers walked through our learning spaces observing the teachers and children at work. Last week I received the letter below from the college.

Dear Mrs Hines and all at Holy Spirit,

How appropriate is the name of your beautiful school. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are there in abundance: the calm, the peace, the energy, the wisdom, the organisation, the joy, the self-control, the patience and kindness.

This was a very significant visit for our staff. One could not escape the engagement, the differentiation and the independence of the learning so clearly present from Kindergarten to Year 6.

It was a revelation to everyone, for example, to hear a Year 1 student correctly label a sentence as a compound sentence and to hear Year 6 students working on a task involving an understanding of a Cartesian number plane.

Your students were so engaged. Not once did we hear a teacher raise her/his voice. There was a tranquil excitement for many. Students' self-assessment was taking place as they worked on the task. They could clearly describe what they were doing and how well they were going, and they were proud of what they were doing. It was impressive.

The separation of instructional space and working space struck us. As did the fact that when students moved to their workspace, the clarity of direction meant not one student put up a hand to ask what to do.

Most students could work independently, enabling teachers to work in individualised ways with students with different needs. The aesthetic and educational value of the visual displays inspired and motivated us and, we're sure, your students alike. The learning intentions and success criteria were written in such a way that their meaning was accessible to all students.

Please accept our deepest thanks. There was so much to admire and learn from. Be assured you could not be doing more to prepare your students for secondary school. With very best wishes on behalf of Emmaus.

2016 Diocesan Tuition Fees and School Based Fees

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Term 1, 2 and 3. The fee is only charged for the first three (3) children currently enrolled in the Diocese (in other words there is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the Diocese or other participating Catholic schools). To work out how much the fee is for each child, check the table below.

Diocesan Building Levy - 2016

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. <u>The levy for 2016 is \$735 per family</u>, payable in three equal instalments of \$245 payable in Terms 1,2 & 3.

Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee - 2016

The Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee for 2016 is \$1,815 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$605 in Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173,401, 411,415,416,418,419,420,421,422,423,426,427,428,442,457,459,476,485,497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged the fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a per family basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Holy Spirit School Based Fees for 2016—In addition to Diocesan fees

Excursion Payment

This one payment covers all one-day excursions and special events. This payment is based on the cost of individual grade excursions and therefore varies across grades. K-2 - \$50, Years 3-6 - \$65. Overnight camps are in addition to this.

Maintenance Fee/Cleaning Levy

For school cleaning and to purchase equipment for ongoing improvements. \$75 per family per year paid over Terms 1,2 &3.

Resource Fees

\$100.00 per year, per child. This is added to Term 1 fees.

Technology Levy

To provide computers, purchase relevant software and maintain current equipment. \$45.00 per family, per year, payable in Term 1.
