Learning Matters

Dear Parents,

Assessment is an essential component of the teaching and learning cycle. Assessment of learning enables teachers to gather evidence and make judgements about student achievement. Assessment varies and may be used individually or together and formally or informally. Assessments happen throughout the year as teachers continually monitor the progress of each child. This helps to plan, program and ensure that the needs of the students are being met.

Feedback, together with evidence helps teachers decide whether students are ready for the next phase of learning or whether they need further learning experiences to consolidate their knowledge, understanding and skills.

Teachers use their professional judgement within a standards framework to grade children. Reports give information to parents about the progress of their child. It is important to develop a partnership between teachers, parents and students to ensure reporting is timely, accessible and informative.

During the year students receive feedback and are given opportunities to reflect on their learning so that further learning can occur.

At the end of this term parents will have the opportunity to meet with their child's teacher to discuss their report and progress. It is also an opportunity to reflect on goals for student's academic and social growth for the current year.

Teachers at Holy Spirit are continually assessing student progress and achievements. We encourage parents to take the opportunity to discuss their child's progress after Semester reports are completed and sent home at the end of the term. More information will follow in the coming weeks.
