From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Next Sunday we begin a new liturgical year. It is the season of Advent, a season of longing for God, of preparing our hearts and our world to receive God. Many of the Advent readings, including the First Reading and Responsorial Psalm, recall the longing of generation after generation of the people of ancient Israel, who experienced a special covenant with God and who longed for the Messiah whom they believed God would send them. We Christians believe that God fulfilled that promise in the person of Mary's child, Jesus.

The Church goes to the prophet Isaiah for the First Reading to open the new liturgical year. It is a plea to God to 'tear the heavens open and come down' (64:1). The Gospel writers allude to this text in their account of Jesus' Baptism, for they see Jesus as God's answer to Isaiah's plea. The author looks at his world, he finds hearts dulled by a routine of life that pays little or no regard to the sacred. People are living on the surface, not thinking of the One from whom they are receiving life, and not caring to see that their way of life flows from God's inspiration and grace. The prophet looks around and sees people getting on with existence, but neglecting and failing to get in touch with their deepest longings.

Advent gives us time to stop and prepare our hearts for Jesus' birth at Christmas. (Fr Michael Fallon)

From the Assistant Principal

Catholic Schools in the Parramatta diocese are required to use an A to E scale when reporting to parents. Reports outline progress in curriculum areas, including Religious Education, behaviour, and effort.

Student reports are designed to provide students and parents with a clear picture of a student's achievement at the time of reporting. The report will show the progress the student has made since the previous report.

Information about where a student is in his or her learning can include:

- the kind of knowledge, skills and understanding that your child now demonstrates
- reference to the performance of other students of the same year level. This is seen as a number underneath the given grade.

Learning happens continually during your child's education. The rate and pace of learning is not fixed and constant; different children learn at different rates. A 'C' grade means your child is achieving at their Stage expectations and this result is to be celebrated.

Just for your information a couple of points need to be mentioned before the reports are given out at the end of the term.

- Awards that are listed on the report will be from Semester 2. If your child received an award in Semester 1 they will not be recorded on this report.
- Similarly, "School Involvement" will only list activities from this current semester.

Semester 1 reports covers learning and achievements from Term 1 and 2.

Semester 2 reports covers learning and achievements from Term 3 and 4.

Also, when exercise books come home at the end of the year, spend some time looking at the content and notice the growth your child has made since the beginning of the school year. Their books and semester reports outline their achievements and growth during the year.
